









I'm not saying charts are inherently bad. Plus, sometimes that's what editors want.




WHERE THE NEPAL QUAKE COULD FALL AGAINST THE 10 COSTLIEST


Rather than just showing the numbers, allow your readers to get into the story.


Deaths associated with MERS globally
